

**NOTICE TO ALL PUBLIC SERVANTS, OFFICERS, AGENTS, AND
ENFORCEMENT ENTITIES**

**RE: PUBLIC NOTICE – ACTIVATION OF NATURAL RIGHTS, RELIGIOUS
FREEDOM, LEGAL STATUS, AND FEE SCHEDULE FOR UNLAWFUL
INTERFERENCE**

We, the free people of the island nation called by the name Jamaica, private Jamaican nationals, creation of the Most High, and living men and women, of sound mind and peaceful intent, hereby publish this binding notice of our lawful status and the terms governing all interactions with our person and/or property in public or private spaces.

Upon stepping outside our home or private domain, we are hereby exercising our freedom of religion by interacting with the creation of the one true living god of the Holy Bible. We do not forfeit or diminish any natural rights granted by the Creator, including but not limited to the right to exercise our spiritual convictions, engage in peaceful movement, and be free from any unlawful surveillance, interference, or compelled consent.

This notice shall be deemed in effect and binding upon all people, persons, public officers, agents, law enforcement personnel, and authorities who, by oath or office, are charged to uphold the Jamaica (Constitution) Order in Council 1962 with amendments up to 2015 (hereafter “Jamaica Constitution”) and the natural rights of the people.

ACTIVATED RIGHTS AND PROTECTIONS:

Pursuant to the Jamaica Constitution, and immutable principles of natural law, we hereby affirm and activate the following protections at all times, including upon entering public spaces, all protected rights enumerated in section 13, 14, 15, 16 and 17, including:

1. The right to the free exercise of religion and conscience (Section 13(3)(o));
2. The right to be free from arbitrary search, detention, or interference absent a valid criminal charge (Section 13(3)(g));
3. The right to be informed of the nature and cause of any alleged offence prior to any plea or response (Section 16(6)(b));
4. The right to privacy, property, due process, and liberty in all forms and expressions (Sections 13(3)(j) and 16);
5. The right to freedom of movement and lawful travel (Section 13(3)(f));

6. The right to be presumed innocent and to prepare an adequate defense prior to any trial or punishment (Section 16(6)(a)(d)).

Any assumption of consent, in any form, whether voluntary or involuntary, to interaction with police or other agents in public is hereby revoked, null, and void. Consent shall not be presumed, implied, or coerced through presence in public space, nor private place. Lawful engagement is only valid where a clear and articulable crime has been alleged, with a named injured party and valid jurisdiction.

Any signature or consent obtained by police, while in custody, forceful interaction or under threat, duress or coercion, is of no effect, unauthorized, null and void.

We hereby include and activate all provisions of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in plain language:

Preamble

Whereas recognition of the inherent dignity and of the equal and inalienable rights of all members of the human family is the foundation of freedom, justice and peace in the world,

Whereas disregard and contempt for human rights have resulted in barbarous acts which have outraged the conscience of mankind, and the advent of a world in which human beings shall enjoy freedom of speech and belief and freedom from fear and want has been proclaimed as the highest aspiration of the common people,

Whereas it is essential, if man is not to be compelled to have recourse, as a last resort, to rebellion against tyranny and oppression, that human rights should be protected by the rule of law,

Whereas it is essential to promote the development of friendly relations between nations,

Whereas the peoples of the United Nations have in the Charter reaffirmed their faith in fundamental human rights, in the dignity and worth of the human person and in the equal rights of men and women and have determined to promote social progress and better standards of life in larger freedom,

Whereas Member States have pledged themselves to achieve, in co-operation with the United Nations, the promotion of universal respect for and observance of human rights and fundamental freedoms,

Whereas a common understanding of these rights and freedoms is of the greatest importance for the full realization of this pledge,

Now, therefore,

The General Assembly,

Proclaims this Universal Declaration of Human Rights as a common standard of achievement for all peoples and all nations, to the end that every individual and every organ of society, keeping this Declaration constantly in mind, shall strive by teaching and education to promote respect for these rights and freedoms and by progressive measures, national and international, to secure their universal and effective recognition and observance, both among the peoples of Member States themselves and among the peoples of territories under their jurisdiction.

Article 1

All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights. They are endowed with reason and conscience and should act towards one another in a spirit of brotherhood.

Article 2

Everyone is entitled to all the rights and freedoms set forth in this Declaration, without distinction of any kind, such as race, colour, sex, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status. Furthermore, no distinction shall be made on the basis of the political, jurisdictional or international status of the country or territory to which a person belongs, whether it be independent, trust, non-self-governing or under any other limitation of sovereignty.

Article 3

Everyone has the right to life, liberty and security of person.

Article 4

No one shall be held in slavery or servitude; slavery and the slave trade shall be prohibited in all their forms.

Article 5

No one shall be subjected to torture or to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment.

Article 6

Everyone has the right to recognition everywhere as a person before the law.

Article 7

All are equal before the law and are entitled without any discrimination to equal protection of the law. All are entitled to equal protection against any discrimination in violation of this Declaration and against any incitement to such discrimination.

Article 8

Everyone has the right to an effective remedy by the competent national tribunals for acts violating the fundamental rights granted him by the constitution or by law.

Article 9

No one shall be subjected to arbitrary arrest, detention or exile.

Article 10

Everyone is entitled in full equality to a fair and public hearing by an independent and impartial tribunal, in the determination of his rights and obligations and of any criminal charge against him.

Article 11

Everyone charged with a penal offence has the right to be presumed innocent until proved guilty according to law in a public trial at which he has had all the guarantees necessary for his defence.

No one shall be held guilty of any penal offence on account of any act or omission which did not constitute a penal offence, under national or international law, at the time when it was committed. Nor shall a heavier penalty be imposed than the one that was applicable at the time the penal offence was committed.

Article 12

No one shall be subjected to arbitrary interference with his privacy, family, home or correspondence, nor to attacks upon his honour and reputation. Everyone has the right to the protection of the law against such interference or attacks.

Article 13

Everyone has the right to freedom of movement and residence within the borders of each state.

Everyone has the right to leave any country, including his own, and to return to his country.

Article 14

Everyone has the right to seek and to enjoy in other countries asylum from persecution.

This right may not be invoked in the case of prosecutions genuinely arising from non-political crimes or from acts contrary to the purposes and principles of the United Nations.

Article 15

Everyone has the right to a nationality.

No one shall be arbitrarily deprived of his nationality nor denied the right to change his nationality.

Article 16

Men and women of full age, without any limitation due to race, nationality or religion, have the right to marry and to found a family. They are entitled to equal rights as to marriage, during marriage and at its dissolution.

Marriage shall be entered into only with the free and full consent of the intending spouses.

The family is the natural and fundamental group unit of society and is entitled to protection by society and the State.

Article 17

Everyone has the right to own property alone as well as in association with others.

No one shall be arbitrarily deprived of his property.

Article 18

Everyone has the right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion; this right includes freedom to change his religion or belief, and freedom, either alone or in community with others and in public or private, to manifest his religion or belief in teaching, practice, worship and observance.

Article 19

Everyone has the right to freedom of opinion and expression; this right includes freedom to hold opinions without interference and to seek, receive and impart information and ideas through any media and regardless of frontiers.

Article 20

Everyone has the right to freedom of peaceful assembly and association.

No one may be compelled to belong to an association.

Article 21

Everyone has the right to take part in the government of his country, directly or through freely chosen representatives.

Everyone has the right of equal access to public service in his country.

The will of the people shall be the basis of the authority of government; this will shall be expressed in periodic and genuine elections which shall be by universal and equal suffrage and shall be held by secret vote or by equivalent free voting procedures.

Article 22

Everyone, as a member of society, has the right to social security and is entitled to realization, through national effort and international co-operation and in accordance with the organization and resources of each State, of the economic, social and cultural rights indispensable for his dignity and the free development of his personality.

Article 23

Everyone has the right to work, to free choice of employment, to just and favourable conditions of work and to protection against unemployment.

Everyone, without any discrimination, has the right to equal pay for equal work.

Everyone who works has the right to just and favourable remuneration ensuring for himself and his family an existence worthy of human dignity, and supplemented, if necessary, by other means of social protection.

Everyone has the right to form and to join trade unions for the protection of his interests.

Article 24

Everyone has the right to rest and leisure, including reasonable limitation of working hours and periodic holidays with pay.

Article 25

Everyone has the right to a standard of living adequate for the health and well-being of himself and of his family, including food, clothing, housing and medical care and necessary social services, and the right to security in the event of unemployment, sickness, disability, widowhood, old age or other lack of livelihood in circumstances beyond his control.

Motherhood and childhood are entitled to special care and assistance. All children, whether born in or out of wedlock, shall enjoy the same social protection.

Article 26

Everyone has the right to education. Education shall be free, at least in the elementary and fundamental stages. Elementary education shall be compulsory. Technical and professional education shall be made generally available and higher education shall be equally accessible to all on the basis of merit.

Education shall be directed to the full development of the human personality and to the strengthening of respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms. It shall promote understanding, tolerance and friendship among all nations, racial or religious groups, and shall further the activities of the United Nations for the maintenance of peace.

Parents have a prior right to choose the kind of education that shall be given to their children.

Article 27

Everyone has the right freely to participate in the cultural life of the community, to enjoy the arts and to share in scientific advancement and its benefits.

Everyone has the right to the protection of the moral and material interests resulting from any scientific, literary or artistic production of which he is the author.

Article 28

Everyone is entitled to a social and international order in which the rights and freedoms set forth in this Declaration can be fully realized.

Article 29

Everyone has duties to the community in which alone the free and full development of his personality is possible.

In the exercise of his rights and freedoms, everyone shall be subject only to such limitations as are determined by law solely for the purpose of securing due recognition and respect for the rights and freedoms of others and of meeting the just requirements of morality, public order and the general welfare in a democratic society.

These rights and freedoms may in no case be exercised contrary to the purposes and principles of the United Nations.

Article 30

Nothing in this Declaration may be interpreted as implying for any State, group or person any right to engage in any activity or to perform any act aimed at the destruction of any of the rights and freedoms set forth herein.

NOTICE OF STATUS:

We are not a commercial entity, resident instrumentality, nor an artificial legal construct. We stand as a free, self-governing people collective of men and women, in full possession of our rights, liberties, and religious freedoms. We reject and nullify all contracts, licenses, or assumptions made without full, informed, voluntary consent.

FEE SCHEDULE FOR UNLAWFUL ACTION:

Any public servant, law enforcement officer, or agency who infringes, violates, or disregards the rights herein stated shall incur the following fee, per incident, per occurrence, per person (human, person, juristic or office holder):

- JMD \$5,000,000 (Five Million Jamaican Dollars) per violation, per incident, per day or portion thereof for any unlawful interaction, coercion, harassment, verbal abuse, deprivation or misconduct.
- JMD \$50,000,000 (Fifty Million Jamaican Dollars) for any unlawful action resulting in serious life threatening injury or death.
- JMD \$500,000 (Five Hundred Thousand Jamaican Dollars) per day for any unlawful taking of property without due process of law.
- JMD \$25,000,000 (Twenty Five Million Jamaican Dollars) per day for unlawful incarceration, kidnapping, or involuntary taking of any individual by intention or mistake.
- JMD \$25,000,000 (Twenty Five Million Jamaican Dollars) for unlawful action involving torture, rape, beating, and/or any other physical violation of human rights.
- JMD \$5,000,000 (Five Million Jamaican Dollars) Per violation, per day for denial of due process of law, prior to the deprivation of right or property, that does not include incarceration.
- JMD \$25,000,000 (Twenty Five Million Jamaican Dollars) Per incident, for denial of due process of law, prior to the deprivation of right or property, and includes incarceration.

This includes but is not limited to:

- Unlawful stop, questioning, or detention in the absence of a crime;
- Use of force or intimidation in the absence of a crime;
- Obstruction of spiritual or religious exercise;
- Any administrative ticket, fixed penalty notice, citation, or penalty issued without jurisdiction and due process.

This declaration is peaceful, lawful, valid, and binding. All actions taken against these terms are done at full commercial and personal liability.

Constitutional Limits on Police Authority and Invalidity of Civil Enforcement by the Constabulary Force

This declaration further clarifies the constitutional breach caused by enforcement of administrative statutes and civil penalties by members of the Jamaica Constabulary Force.

1. The Constabulary Force Act, Section 13, expressly provides that members of the Force are employed solely for the detection of crimes, the preservation of the peace, and the apprehension of offenders (in relation to a crime). The act states unequivocally: **"No member of the Force shall be employed to execute any civil process."**
2. A civil process includes acts that fail to meet the criminal elements under common law, but is not limited to: **traffic citations, administrative fines, ticketing regimes, seizure of documents**, seizure of property and any form of compelled compliance where there is no allegation of a crime (i.e., no injured party, no damage, no malicious intent).
3. The Constitution of Jamaica, under Section 2, confirms that it is the supreme law of the land. All laws, regulations, or practices inconsistent with the Constitution are void to the extent of the inconsistency.
4. Therefore, the enforcement of statutes such as the Road Traffic Act of 2018 and associated Regulations, enforced by police officers—where no crime has occurred and no judicial process has been initiated—violates both the constitutional supremacy clause and the statutory limits of police authority.

5. Any act by a police officer purporting to enforce a civil matter constitutes an ultra vires action (beyond the scope of lawful duty) and renders such officer personally and commercially liable for exceeding their constitutional mandate.

6. These acts amount to administrative coercion without jurisdiction and violate the principles of due process, lawful delegation, and the separation of powers.

This addendum reinforces that unless there is a clearly defined criminal offence supported by constitutional and statutory authority, no member of the Jamaica Constabulary Force has lawful power to detain, fine, ticket, or interfere with any private individual under the guise of civil enforcement.

We hereby **reject and rebut** any and all presumptions or classifications by any state agent or agency—including the **Jamaica Customs Agency**—that treat **our personal property, household items, or effects** as “goods” under commercial law **without proof of trade or resale intent**.

Inspection alone is not lawful basis to impose duties, taxes, fines, or forfeiture upon private property not acquired nor intended for commerce. Such actions constitute **unjust enrichment, abuse of administrative discretion, and a violation of constitutional rights**.

Henceforth, all agencies, agents, officers, or representatives acting in contravention of these rights are hereby placed **on notice** and may be held personally liable for **constitutional violations, conversion, and unlawful deprivation of property**.

Public Enforcement Clause

Whereas the Jamaica Constitution affirms fundamental rights and freedoms but provides no explicit penalty for their violation, and whereas the State's agents have repeatedly acted beyond their lawful limits under the guise of regulation and enforcement,

We, the People of Jamaica, as the original grantors of governmental authority, do hereby establish this Public Declaration and Mandate as a lawful mechanism of enforcement. This declaration shall operate as binding notice under the doctrines of constructive notice, estoppel by acquiescence, and public trust.

All violations of the rights herein declared—whether by man, woman, officer, agent, or institution—shall trigger immediate personal, commercial, and constitutional liability, enforceable by public claim, lien, affidavit, or lawful remedy in equity.

Where the Constitution is silent on penalties, the people shall speak—and their voice shall be binding.

Voice of The People of Jamaica A Lawful Declaration under the Constitution of Jamaica

We, the People of Jamaica, acting under our original constitutional authority pursuant to the **Jamaica (Constitution) Order in Council 1962**, hereby issue a **Public Constitutional Declaration**.

This declaration:

1. **Activates rights** under Section 13(3) of the Charter of Rights,
2. **Preserves and activates protections** under Sections 14–17,
3. **Challenges unconstitutional statutes and unlawful police conduct** under Section 19,
4. **Preserves the right of redress**, immediately upon breach by any public authority,
5. **Invokes all articles of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights**, and
6. **Establishes binding notice and a fee schedule** for violations of declared rights.

We do not act as a political party, corporate entity, or commercial organization.

We act as the **lawful stewards and beneficiaries** of the Constitution — not by permission, but by **inherent, God-given right**.

PORT OF SPAIN (CMG):

ST VINCENT and the Grenadines Prime Minister, Dr Ralph Gonsalves, is urging Trinidad and Tobago and Venezuela to exercise restraint and resolve their differences peacefully and in line with international law, after both countries made contrasting statements regarding an alleged port to overthrow the Nicolas Maduro government in the South American country.

"All I would like to do is to urge both neighbours to continue to act peacefully in accordance with international law," Gonsalves, one of the longest serving leaders in CARICOM, told the **Trinidad Guardian** newspaper, warning against inflaming the situation with strong language.

"As far as practicable, we do not incline the situation with any excessive rhetoric. We just take our patience into account. And whatever is the problem, we solve them maturely between two neighbours," said Gonsalves, a former Pro-Tempore president of the 33-member Community of Latin America and the Caribbean (CELAC) that includes both Trinidad and Tobago and Venezuela.

Last Friday, the Venezuelan government expressed "its profound surprise at the irate

and unjustified reaction" of the Trinidad and Tobago government in response to what it termed as a "legitimate complaint" by President Maduro about the attempts to overthrow his administration by mercenaries using Trinidad and Tobago.

"Venezuela has captured criminals of Trinidadian origin, who have confessed their plans, statements that have been duly supported with compelling evidence presented by the competent authorities," Caracas said in a statement.

Last Thursday night, Prime Minister Kamla Persad Bissessar said that it took "very seriously" threats being made by Venezuela to track down any person outside of the South American country.

She told a post-Cabinet news conference that she had also been aware of statements made by Venezuelan Justice Minister,

Diosdado Cabello, that a Trinidad and Tobago national was involved in "terrorist activities" aimed at destabilising Venezuela earlier this week.

Cabello has since identified the Trinidadian national as 'Gis Kendel Jheron', and repeated accusations made by President

"We are going after the gangs, wherever they are. Together, we will guarantee peace in this country," he said.

But Prime Minister Persad Bissessar told reporters that there was no evidence to support the comments made by Cabello, adding "today I want to make it very clear to the Venezuelan government and officials that they can do whatever they want on Venezuelan territory, but they cannot come here".

Trinidad and Tobago police say that the person named by Cabello had not appeared in the country's criminal database.

Gonsalves said that while he is not ruling out intervening in the ongoing impasse between the two countries, he is nonetheless urging peace.

"I'm urging peace and calm," Gonsalves said, re-affirming CARICOM's and the region's

broader commitment to peace.

"That would be what my own broad position would do as someone who supports very much — and we all do, and CARICOM does, and so too does Venezuela — we support our region as a region of peace. We want to see good neighbourliness.

"If there is any challenge which arises, we should not interfere in the internal affairs of any other state. We should not bring any foreign power into this particular matter. This is a matter which we have to be careful that is not blown out of proportions," Gonsalves told the **Trinidad Guardian** newspaper.

Meanwhile, the Minister in the Office of the Prime Minister, Barry Padarath, has come out in support of Persad Bissessar over what he described as her strong, bold, and courageous stance in the situation between the two countries.

"For 10 years, the PNM (People's National Movement) pussyfooted around the President of Venezuela and the issues that surrounded Venezuela as they related to the hydrocarbon sector and the relationship that Trinidad and Tobago has with Venezuela, but also the relationship of one of our major trading partners, the US, has with Venezuela.

Some visitors report extra scrutiny as Trump's new travel ban begins

MIAMI (AP):

PRESIDENT DONALD Trump's new ban on travel to the U.S. by citizens from a dozen countries took effect Monday with relative

calm, as some travelers with valid visas reported extra scrutiny at American airports before being allowed entry.

The ban targeting mainly African

and Middle Eastern countries kicked in amid rising tension over the president's escalating campaign of immigration enforcement. But it arrived with

no immediate signs of the chaos that unfolded at airports across the US during Trump's first travel ban in 2017.

Vincenta Aguilar said she was anxious Monday as she and her husband, both Guatemalan

citizens, were subjected to three different interviews by US officials after arriving at Miami International Airport and showing tourist visas the couple received last week.

"They asked us where we work, how many children we have, if we have had any problems with the law, how we are going to afford the cost of this travel, how many days we will stay here," said Aguilar,

who along with her husband was visiting their son for the first time since he left Guatemala 22 years ago.

She said they were released about an hour after their flight landed, greeting their waiting family members in Florida with tears of relief. Guatemala is not among the countries included in the new ban or flagged for extra travel restrictions.

The new proclamation that Trump signed last week applies to citizens of Afghanistan, Myanmar, Chad, the Republic of Congo, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Haiti, Iran, Libya, Somalia, Sudan and Yemen. It also imposes heightened restrictions on people from Burundi, Cuba, Laos, Sierra Leone, Togo, Turkmenistan and Venezuela who are outside the US and don't hold a valid visa.

The new ban does not revoke visas previously issued to people from countries on the list, according to guidance issued Friday to all US diplomatic missions. However, unless an applicant meets narrow criteria for an exemption to the ban, his or her application will be rejected starting Monday. Travellers with previously issued visas should still be able to enter the US even after the ban takes effect.
